Professor Subhash Padhye

Director at Interdisciplinary Science and Technology Research Academy & NIH Visiting Professor at Kansas University Medical Center, USA.

Experienced Director skilled in Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Drug Discovery, Life Sciences and Biochemistry. A Strong professional with Post-Doctoral experience in “Synthetic Mimics of Proteins” at University of Illinois- Urbana-Champaign, Drug Design and Discovery at Wayne State University, Michigan as well as Kansas State Cancer Center, Kansas City He is also the Director of Interdisciplinary Science & Technology Research Academy (ISTRA) affiliated to University of Pune. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Chemistry and an affiliate member of the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry. He has been a Fulbright Professor at University of Illinois at Urbana, University of Colorado at Boulder and Arizona State University at Tempe. He has been the British Council Professor at University of Manchester and University of Hull. He has published over 299 papers, 5 books and 11 book chapters. He is on the editorial boards of 6 international journals and holds 4 international patents, one of which is out-licensed to an American firm. He has been invited to present research seminars in almost all major universities in the world. Presently his group is working on two major projects-one dealing with 'Targeting cancer stem cells with phytochemical analogs' and the other dealing with 'Re-purposing of FDA approved drugs for anticancer therapy.
